Estimated number of Hispanic Kansans as of July 1, 2009. This is 9.3% of the state's population. Hispanic Americans account for 15.8% of the total U.S. population.

199,968

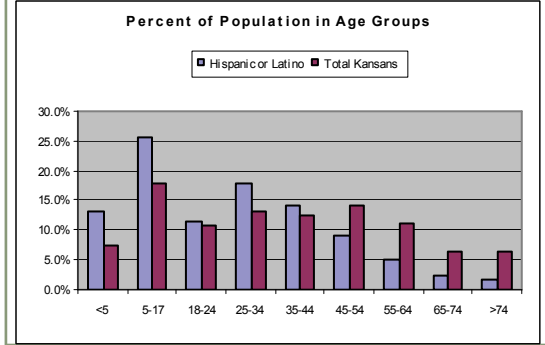
There are 199,968 more Hispanic Americans in Kansas today than in 1980. That is a 316% increase, compared to a 19.3% increase in the total number of Kansans during that period.

The projected Hispanic population in Kansas in 2030, according to Woods and Poole Economics, Inc.

1,855

The number of Hispanic Americans in Kansas who serve in the armed forces. This is 1.1% of those over the age of 16, compared with 0.8% for the total Kansas population. There are 6,185 Hispanic American veterans living in Kansas.

The percent of the Hispanic population under age 18, compared to 24.9% of the general Kansas population.

The median age of Hispanic persons in Kansas. 35.9 years is the median age for all Kansans, and 36.8 for the United States.

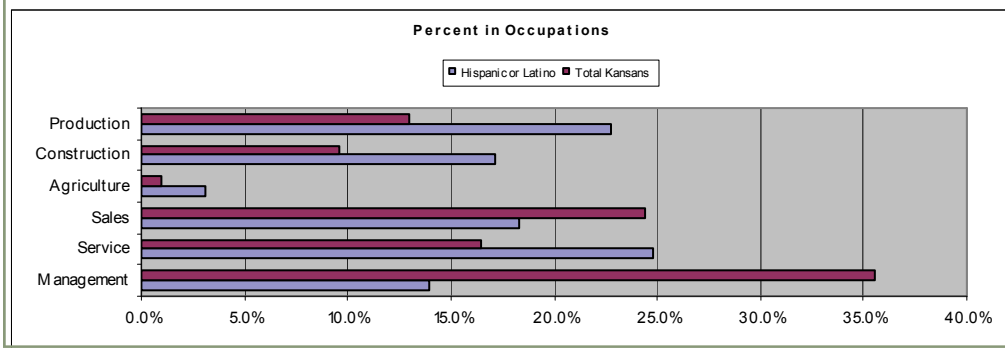
