Notice Print All Around You



Point out different words on signs. Let your child handle books and help you turn pages.



Talk, Talk, Talk



Use lots of language with young children, even when they don't understand.

By reading aloud to your children, you can help get them ready to read with these 6 skills by 6 years of age.

Look for Letters Everywhere



Children need to recognize that letters are different from each other, with different shapes, names and sounds.

Tell Stories About Everything



Understanding the sequence of events in a story will help children's comprehension.

Take Time to Rhyme, Sing & Play Word Games



Songs and rhymes help children learn to hear that words are made up of smaller parts.
